Barbara's accounting career began in 1989 as Senior Associate at Coopers & Lybrand, which was renamed PriceWaterhouseCoopers in 1993. While at PwC, Barbara held both the Senior Auditor and Audit Manager positions, until moving to Intensiva Healthcare from 1996-1997. Her upward trajectory continued from there:

In 1997, she went to work for UnitedHeathcare, holding the positions of Director of Finance, Regional Finance Director, and Chief Financial Officer/Finance Director.

While working full-time at UHC, Barbara attended Saint Louis University and received her MBA in Finance in 2001. She then attended the Saint Louis University School of Law, graduating with honors in 2008.

In 2009, Barbara was hired by Capes, Sokol, Goodman & Sarachan, PC as an attorney specializing in state and federal tax law, as well as white collar criminal defense.

In 2010, Barbara was hired by Delta Dental of Missouri as Chief Financial Officer. In 2018, she also took on the responsibilities as In-House General Counsel. Barbara maintained this position until her passing in 2023.

Barbara served on the board of YWCA Metro St. Louis from 2013-2018, as both Treasurer and Board Chairwoman. She remained an active volunteer and supporter until her passing. In addition to YWCA, Barbara was a supporter of Women's Another Chance, American Heart Association, USO, and St. Jude's Children's Hospital.

Having the support to attain a quality education opened many doors for Barbara. Her continued education propelled her to achieve many academic awards, corporate awards, and recognition for community service.
